Use Google Maps to find Employers in your area

You can find companies related to your occupation in google maps. First enter your postal code in google maps search. After that in advanced option select business and search for your occupation.

Like if your Postal code is M1H 2Y4 enter it in google maps search. Than in advance option select business and search as example “ Accounting” . All accounting firms in your area will come in result page on google maps. Collect FAX numbers of that companies and send your resume to them.

Take help of Local Yellowpages

Majority of job seekers hardly know 5 to 6 job agencies in their area. They never try to find out how many employment agencies in their city. Take help of local yellow pages; make a list of fax number and fax resume to all of them. Remember you need just 1 job among thousands of jobs in market!

Join Professional Associations and Membership Sites

Join an association in whatever field interests you and become an active member. Meet as many members as possible to learn about the industry and uncover some opportunities. Surf the Internet and find the association's web site to learn about conferences and other events you can participate in. Talk to someone in the same field and interview for information about the position and industry you are interested.

Networking

Networking consists of connecting with a wide variety of individuals who may be able to help with your job hunt and career planning. Network with people at a higher level so you can find the type of jobs that might interest you. Discover which skills and experiences are relevant.
